English is the working language of the committee. All delegates must speak in English during debates and lobby time.

CCBMUN



The United Nations is a formal organization, therefore, proper parliamentary language must be used during sessions.

As delegates, you must refer to any other nation with respect and honour. You will be representing your country, NOT your personal opinion, which means that you must always speak in the third person.

Examples:

This delegation invites the nations present to... (NOT: I invite)

As the delegation said before (NOT: as I said before)

Does the delegate of consider (NOT: Do you consider)

Prohibited words

Word	Synonym
Money	Monetary resources
War	Armed conflicts/ belligerent conflicts
Terrorist (depends)	Depends on the qualification the U.N. gives to a certain group. Never refers to a country. (insurgent/militant)
Poverty	Low resources (hardship)
Rich (country)	High income (more economically developed)
Undeveloped/Underdeveloped/Third World	Developing
Empire	Never used
Guns	Weapons
World powers	Never used
Corruption	Political dishonesty



Certain words may not be used during the model. You will need to use alternatives.
